



The standard order of a typical English sentence is **SUBJECT** - **VERB** - **OBJECT**.
The **SUBJECT** is what the sentence is about and is the most important position in the sentence. The **OBJECT** is a second person or thing in the sentence. Not every sentence will have an object but every sentence will have a **SUBJECT** and **VERB**. The subject and object will always be either a noun or pronoun. You should always place the most important noun or pronoun in the position of subject because it leads the sentence and gives it clarity.
